| Project title                       | Come and visit us: a cross curricular project using Photo Story   |  |  |  |  |

| Context of project                  | This is a cross curricular project which can be run in conjunction with the MFL department.  Students research a favourite holiday destination and choose suitable images which represent that destination. They then use a software application called Photo Story to develop a short multi media video which could be used as promotional material by a tourist board.  Students then develop their original video to include sub titles and recorded speech in a different language.  Students learn about the importance of choosing appropriate and relevant images and how to optimise images for use in a multi media project. |  |  |  |  |

| Main activity | Introduction to the project Ask students to think of somewhere they've been on holiday or somewhere they've visited and what they did whilst there. Ask a couple of students to share their experiences, and if they would recommend somewhere else to go their.  |             |
|               | Paired discussion Ask students what a travel agent or tourist board could use to advertise or persuade people to visit a country. Students will probably say brochure, website, poster, TV advert etc. Share suggestions with class and record on white board   | 2.5 mins    |
|               | Group task In small groups students should work together to complete the mind map.doc task. Mind map answers.doc are provided for the teacher.  | 7.5 mins    |
|               | Feedback ideas to the class.  |             |
|               | Teacher information and demonstration Display 'what is photostory.ppt' on the board.  | 2.5 mins    |
|               | Explain to students that photo story is a piece of software that allows users to make video using just still digital photos.  |             |
|               | Show example photostory: Whitby.wmv   |             |
|               | Paired discussion Ask students to think about what type of images would be best to promote a holiday destination.   | 2.5 mins    |
|               | Feedback to the class. Possible answers might include:  |             |
|               | <ul> <li>Positive images – good weather, clean, happy people</li> <li>Good quality images – not blurry or pixilated</li> <li>A range of images – not just the same thing</li> <li>Suitable for audience and location – It the holiday is for over 60s theme parks and playground will probably not be suitable</li> </ul> |             |
|               | Teacher information Show 'image suitability.ppt' on the whiteboard and go through the different points with students.   | 7.5<br>mins |
|               | Once students have an understanding of what makes suitable images. Explain to students that they will be creating video using only still images to promote a holiday destination. This could be somewhere they have visited previously, a video for the town they live in or a place they'd love to go.                   | 5 mins      |
